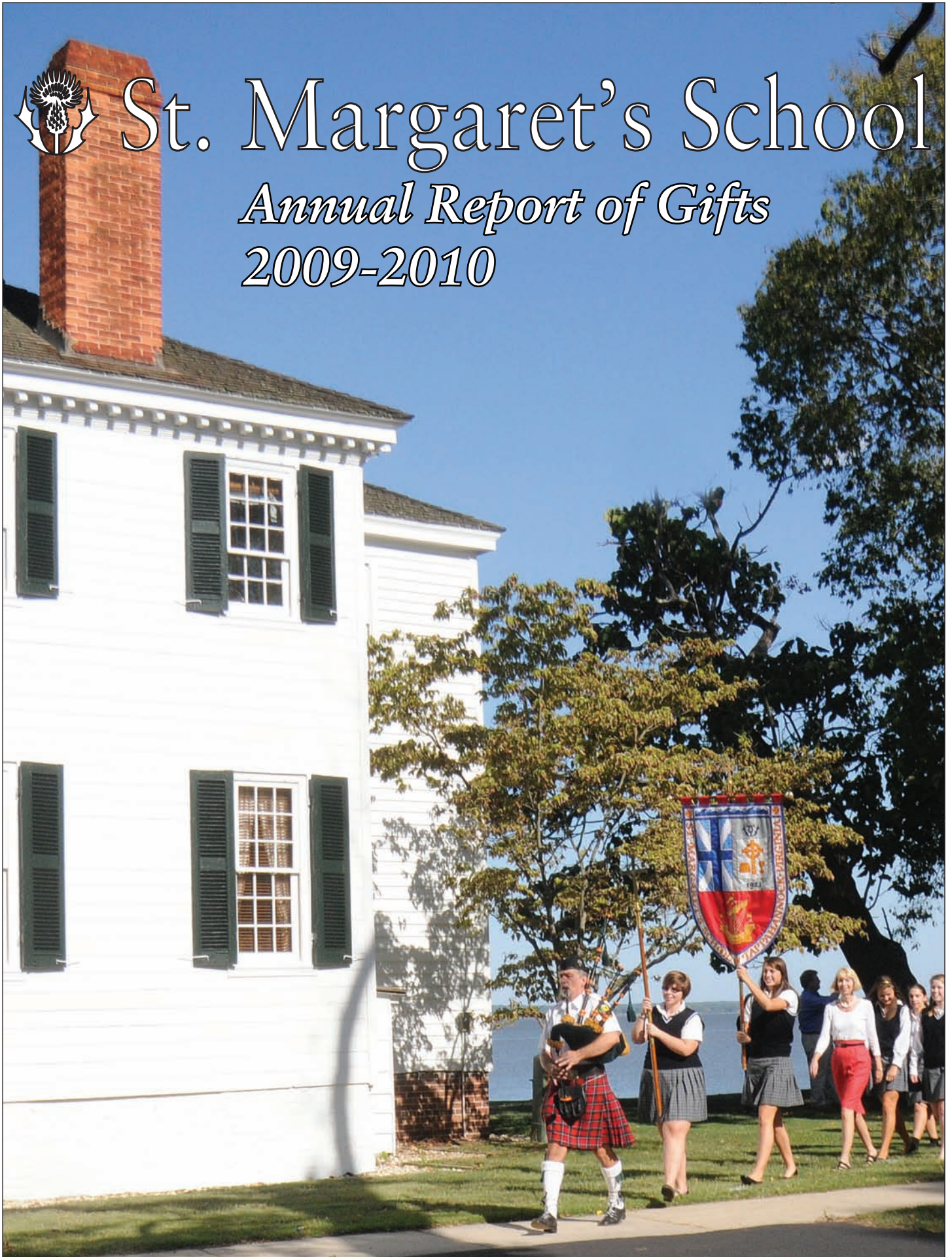


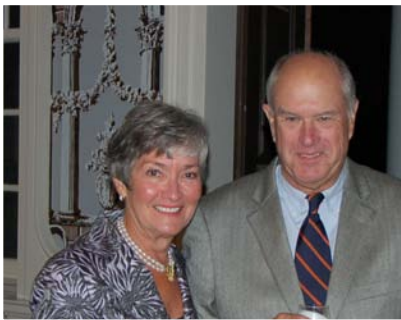


St. Margaret's School

This year, Jane Schwenck, Class of 1947, honored us with the second largest bequest in the history of the school. Her unrestricted gift of \$376,000 has been credited to the current endowment/capital campaign where it will provide significant support to the board's strategic goals for the school. We accept this gift with joy and deep appreciation and hope it will inspire others to include St. Margaret's in their gift planning.

According to her executor and cousin, Janet Whitehead, Jane loved her St. Margaret's years and would have embraced the diversity we've deliberately brought to our school community as both necessary and enriching. A life-long Episcopalian, democrat, and annual fund donor, Jane was generous to many causes and made all of her planned gifts to Episcopal entities.
